### Criminal Justice System News

**Adult Incarceration:** Bookings fell from September (10,833) to October (10,468). However, *the average daily population was again over 10,000*, from September's 10,146 to October's 10,201. Four months into FY06, the average ADP is nearly 900 higher than FY05's ADP of 9,054. Additionally, *the average length of stay reached 30 days for the first time ever*; it was 28.1 days in September, increasing to 30.2 days in October.

*The ALOS for agency holds increased from 70.3 days to 79.4 days. Pretrial ALOS increased from 8.4 days to 8.5 days. Pretrial felony ALOS increased from 12.9 days to 13.5 days. Pretrial misdemeanor ALOS decreased from 3.7 days to 3.5 days. ALOS for the sentenced population decreased from 32.6 days to 31 days.*

**Filings & Case Processing:** While October's 2,852 Superior Court filings was a decrease from September's 3,283, terminations were nearly the same (2,834 in October, 2,865 in September). The resulting termination rate of 99% is the highest since October 2004. *The active pending case inventory decreased from 11,265 to 10,964.* FY06-to-date numbers are nearly 1,000 higher than the FY05 active pending inventory. *Filings into the RCC and EDC continued to decrease in October.* RCC's 1,610 filings are the fewest since February 2005, while the 788 EDC/Direct Complaints are the fewest since October 2004. The trial rate of 2.1% is the highest since September 2004.


**Adult Probation:** Although levels of pretrial general supervision were down from 890 in September to 807 in October, *intensive and electronic monitoring numbers increased.* Intensive numbers went from 1,001 to 1,093, while electronic monitoring numbers went from 178 to 180.

*Levels of standard and intensive probation supervision increased from September to October.* Standard probation went from 27,044 to 27,189, intensive from 1,330 to 1,362.


**Juvenile Detention and Probation:** *The average daily population increased from 403 in September to 426 in October. The length of stay decreased slightly from 17.7 to 17.3 days. Electronic monitoring saw an increase, from 63 to 84, due to better data collection. Home detention continued to fall from 223 to 218.*

*Levels of juvenile standard and intensive probation decreased slightly.* Standard went from 4,094 to 4,049, intensive from 566 to 541.




# Average Daily Jail Population



# Average Daily Jail Population by Type




# Average Length of Stay in Jail for Agency Holds




# Average Length of Stay in Jail Pretrial vs Sentenced Population



# Average Length of Stay in Jail for Pretrial Inmates




# Sheriff's Office Transports for Inmate Court Appearances





# Superior Court Filings and Terminations


Direct Filing began in May 2002




# Direct Complaints into Superior Court




# Grand Jury Indictments



# Superior Court Trials Completed




# Active Pending Criminal Case Inventory




# Pretrial Supervision

## Defendant Monitoring Unit




# Pretrial Supervision Defendants on Electronic Monitoring




# Disposition of Cases Terminated

Average monthly dispositions by quarter



# Status of Cases After 180 Days




# Adult Probation Standard Supervision Population




# Adult Probation Intensive Supervision Population




# Juvenile Detention Average Daily Population



# Juvenile Detention Average Length of Stay




# Juvenile Electronic Monitoring
