

Preventive Health Medications Without Cost-Sharing

A Provision of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA)



Certain preventative medications will be offered to plan participants at 100% coverage when utilizing in-network providers. These products include:

- Aspirin OTC
 - Prescription required
 - For participants 45 years and older
- Folic Acid
 - Prescription required
 - Single ingredient and prenatal vitamins that contain 400mcg to 800mcg of folic acid
 - For female participants less than 55 years only
- Fluoride products
 - Prescription required
 - Single ingredient generic products only
 - For participants 6 months to 6 years
- Iron supplements
 - Prescription required
 - For participants 6 to 12 months
- Female Contraceptive Products
 - Generic products only (unless none is available)
 - Limited to 1 tablet per day
 - Emergency contraceptive limited to 2 courses per year

Additional medications include:

- Emergency contraceptives – generics only; exclude branded products; quantity limit of 2 courses per year; not eligible for 90-day supply
 - Oral Contraceptives – Quantity limit of 1 tab per day applies to all products
 - Monophasic, Biphasic, Triphasic, Extended Cycle – generics only; exclude branded products;
 - Four-phasic – only brand product available within drug class (Natazia)
 - Contraceptive Patch – only brand product available within drug class (Ortho-Evra); quantity limit of 3 patches per month
 - Contraceptive Ring – only brand product available within drug class (Nuvaring); quantity limit of 1 ring per month
 - Injectables Contraceptives – generics only; exclude branded products; quantity limit of 1 injection per 90 days
- Covered at \$0 copay prescription contraceptive devices as follows:
- Diaphragms - Quantity limit of 1 unit per year
 - Cervical caps - Quantity limit of 1 unit per year
 - Contraceptive Implants (eligible for inclusion only if clients choose to cover through prescription benefit)
 - IUD (eligible for inclusion if clients choose to cover through prescription benefit)
